Fuelwood Special Stipulations

These special stipulations are part of your permit and must be in your possession when gathering and transporting fuelwood upon public lands or roads.

- 1) The wood cutting permit is non-transferable and must be in the permit holder's possession while harvesting and transporting wood.
- 2) Wood collection is restricted to dead and down mesquite only; no cutting, injuring, or removing any live tree is permitted.
- 3) Permits are only valid on public lands administered by Bureau of Land Management within the areas specified on the map provided. No wood may be collected outside of these designated areas.
- 4) Use of any power saws requires a working exhaust system equipped with a spark arrestor and users must have a fire extinguisher available.
- 5) Leave gates as you find them.
- 6) The permit will expire on the date indicated whether fuelwood is removed or not.
- 7) Use equipment that is clean and free of dirt, seed, of other vegetative debris. Clean equipment prior to arrival at wood collection site.
- 8) Motorized travel off designated routes is acceptable for permit holders for one trip to load fuelwood. All off-road travel must be done to the minimum extent possible. Do not travel off road if muddy conditions are present.
- 9) LOAD TAG IS VALID ONLY FOR ONE TRIP AND MUST BE USED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF ISSUANCE. The validated tag must be affixed at the back of the load prior to moving the vehicle and must be clearly visible.

General Stipulations listed on the permit also apply. Violation of any General Conditions and Fuelwood Special Stipulations listed on your permit may result in citations and/or suspension of firewood cutting privileges.

VIOLATION FINES:

Pursuant to 43 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 4140.1b3- Cutting, destroying, or removing vegetation without authorization carries a collateral fine of \$275.00.
