


BLM Fuelwood Special Stipulations

These Special Stipulations are part of your permit and must be in the permittee's possession when gathering and transporting fuelwood upon public lands or roads.

1. It is your responsibility to ensure you are on BLM designated lands when cutting.
2. A valid Fuelwood cutting permit must be in possession at all times when cutting and when transporting fuelwood.
3. Load tickets must be validated and attached to loads before transporting.
4. Fuelwood permits are non-transferable, the permittee or an immediate family member must be present during cutting and transportation of firewood.
5. Permit period runs from May 1st - November 30 (single permits are good for 90days).
6. CUT DEAD or DOWN MATERIAL ONLY, do not leave "hanging" trees.
7. DO NOT CUT wildlife nesting snags or any trees marked for wildlife protection
8. Do not cut within 50 ft of a dry stream course or within 100 ft of a live stream or shoreline.
9. Do not cut trees with any paint, signs, or other markings.
10. Do not cut within campgrounds, active Timber Sales, No Firewood Cutting areas or other developed recreation sites. i.e. *boat ramps, picnic sites, parking areas, etc.*
11. All slash material(limbs) will be scattered. Do not deposit or leave slash material on road shoulders, in ditches, culverts or stream course.
12. All Stumps will be no higher than twelve (12) inches about the ground.
13. PLEASE DO NOT LITTER.
14. Leave gates as you found them.
15. Fuelwood is for personal use only. NOT FOR RESALE.
16. Stay within 100' of designated roads and trails when loading, unless otherwise specified. Refer to your desired BLM areas travel management plan regarding route designation.
17. Areas may open and close as weather and road conditions allow; no hauling is permitted when road conditions are such that damage will result to the road.
18. Any violations will void permit.



Directions

Gateway Fuelwood Harvest Areas: From Grand Junction, go south on U.S. Highway 50 to Whitewater, CO. Turn Right on Colorado Highway 141 and drive approximately 40 miles, then turn left on to route 630. If you get to Gateway, CO, you've gone 5 miles too far. Once on 630:

Bull Hill Area: - Drive 5.3 miles on 630 and turn right on to 10.80. Continue another 2.3 miles to reach the first area, and the other two areas will be within the next 1.1 miles.

Maverick Area: Follow 630 for 5.3 miles when after the turn for 10.80, 630 turns to FS405. Continue for another 2.8 miles until you reach route 11.30 and turn right. Continue on 11.30 for 0.4 miles.

Outlaw Mesa Area: - Continue on 630/FS405 for 13 miles. FS405 will turn to 19.50 after the junction of FS404. Continue another 0.6 miles until you reach 22.30 (~5.3 miles past 11.30). 22.30 is a 3.5 mile loop that will return you to 19.50. There are two more areas past the 2nd junction of 22.30 and 19.50 at 0.3 miles on the right, and 0.7 miles on the left.

Glade Park Wood Cutting Area: From Grand Junction, go west on Colorado 340 to Monument Road. Turn left on to Monument Road and travel ~8 miles to DS.00 Road (Glade Park Turnoff) and take a left. Continue on DS.00 Road for ~5.7 miles until you reach the intersection of 16.50 road and DS.00 Road by the Glade Park Store.

Oak Hill Wood Cutting Area: - Turn Left on to 16.50 Road and continue for ~5.1 miles.

Toms Canyon Wood Cutting Area: - Continue on DS.00 road past the glade park store for another 12.9 miles where you will reach a road on your right hand side (BLM 71308). There is a second entrance to this area another 0.8 miles down the road (BLM 7130). For reference, 5.70 Road will be on the other side of the road in-between these two entrances.

Plateau Valley Wood Cutting Area: From Grand Junction, go east on US Interstate 170 towards Denver, CO. 7 miles past the Palisade exit, turn right on to Colorado Highway 65 going towards the Grand Mesa. Follow Highway 65 for 10 miles until you reach the left hand turn for Colorado Highway 330 towards Collbran, CO. Continue on 330 for 1.7 miles and turn right on to Nichols Gravel Pit Road and continue another 0.6 miles. Turn left on to KE Road and continue for 0.9 miles and then turn right on to 51.1 Road. Continue on this road for ~3.4 miles until you reach the cutting area. The road seemingly ends at a small clearing 0.2 miles later and there is another, less maintained road on the left that goes farther in to the cutting area.

Roan Creek Wood Cutting Area: From De Beque, CO, pass the Kum & Go convenience store. Once you cross the river continue Roan Creek Road for -3.3 miles (This road turns in to 45 road after you pass W 1/2 Rd) and take a left on to Dry Fork Road. Follow Dry Fork Road for 11.5 miles where the road will fork and you will stay left on to 7738 road for another 8.4 miles at which point you will reach the first wood cutting area on the right side of the road. After 1 more mile will be the second area, also in the right side of the road.
