Kanab Field Office (KFO)
Stipulations for Non-Commercial Fuel Wood Sales

A. SALES ADMINISTRATION

1. The purchaser will have a valid permit before cutting or removing any fuel wood.
2. No refunds will be made on permits
3. All fuel wood will be harvested within the time limit specified on the permit, unless changed by the Authorized Officer.
4. Harvest of Fuel wood is restricted to **pinyon and juniper** only.
5. Green (live) or dead pinyon and juniper may be harvested on any Public Land, within the Kanab Field Office Area **EXCEPT**:
 - a. The Paria Wilderness area, Moquith Mountain, Canaan Mountain, North Fork Virgin River, Orderville Canyon, and Parunuweap Canyon Wilderness Study Areas (WSA).
 - b. Non-WSA lands designated as having wilderness characteristics.

B. HARVEST STIPULATIONS

1. If standing dead or live trees are cut, the stump height shall not exceed 6 inches above the ground level measured on the uphill side of the tree.
2. Purchaser shall lop and scatter un-harvested tree limbs and tops (slash) on the cutting area in a manner that the depth of such material does not exceed 18 inches at any point. When slash is reasonably close to gullies, slash will be placed in the gullies.
3. No cutting of multiple trees to be left for future harvest will be allowed.
4. All limbs and debris must be removed off roadways so as not to impede travel or use of the road.

C. SURFACE PROTECTION

1. The purchaser of this permit will immediately suspend and discontinue all operations under this permit upon notification from the Authorized Officer that such operations will cause unnecessary and undue soil compaction or soil erosion within the harvest area due to poor weather conditions. These suspensions are not subject to protest or appeal.

D. WASTE DISPOSAL

1. Harvest sites shall be maintained in a sanitary condition at all times: waste materials at those sites shall be disposed of promptly at an appropriate waste disposal site. Waste means all discarded matter including human waste, trash, garbage, refuse, oil cans, petroleum products, and equipment.

E. FIRE CONTROL

1. During conditions of extreme fire danger fuel wood harvest may be limited or suspended in specific areas, as determined by the Authorized Officer. This determination of extreme fire danger and limitation or suspension of the permit is not subject to protest or appeal.
2. The purchaser of this permit will do all within his/her capability to suppress any fire started in the vicinity of his/her operation area. Additionally, the purchaser will immediately notify a BLM office about the fire.
3. The purchaser may be held liable for fire suppression cost incurred by the BLM for any fire which starts as a result of the purchaser's harvesting operations.

Violations of the above stipulations or other applicable stipulations such as, but not limited to those specified on the permit, will subject the permit holder to citation and criminal prosecution, loss of wood, and revocation of permit.
